Treasurer's Report

- Roughly \$2000 matching funds have come in
- Taxes have been filed

PHE Principal/Staff Report

- Ms. Nicosia will continue to research PE programs for presentation of options to PHEEF
- Currently completing parent-teacher conferences
- Ms. Biven is excited about possibility of science workshops scheduling will be most difficult to overcome
- District and teacher's union are undergoing negotiations for contracts working towards further reducing class sizes, currently at 28 to 1 in 1st grade
- Reading lab is up and running, Computer Lab technician is very accessible
- Bond measure passed in June approximately \$48,000 coming from state, will potentially be used to upgrade wi-fi and to purchase chrome books

 - Hasmig Gregorian reporting reminding members to make sure all communications go to Angela first, then forwarded to Board of Directors, sent to principal for approval, then published
- Spell-A-Thon
 - Jennifer Philson reporting date set for February 5, 2016

Special Committee

- Science
 - Alisa Todd reporting presented science workshop at teacher meeting, would give each class 4 sessions of science, workshops based on Nex-Gen standards

- Have spent approximately \$1000 thus far on kits, workshops will cost approximately \$7000
- Will cost approximately \$18,000 for year-round program

- Vote taken, Motion passes Approved
- Computer tech currently classified as Site Tech 1 does not have authorization to work with all equipment at school, would be improved with Site Tech 2 classification
- Jennifer Philson moves to change the Site Tech 1 position to Site Tech 2 position with the condition that Bridgette Hopkins remains PHE's Site Tech, Alisa Todd seconds motion
- <u>Vote taken, Motion passes Approved</u>
- 5th grade teacher James Brown requesting Smart TV to replace the projector in his classroom
- <u>Nate Lunt makes a motion to approve spending up to \$1000 to purchase a flat screen</u> <u>HDTV with the condition that it meets district policy regarding student privacy. Heidi</u> <u>Mispagel seconds motion</u>
- <u>Vote taken, Motion passes Approved</u>
